The Watermen: Fish Scaler

Founded in 1930s Brooklyn, Jeros Tackle sold and continues to sell popular types of fishing

tackle. The brand Scotchline was a subset of Jeros Tackle that began in the 1960s and continued

to rise in popularity; these fish scalers come from Scotchline. Today, Jeros Tackle items are sold

on tackle websites but not on the company's website (17).

Fish scalers are used to pull the scales and outer skin off of fish before they are sold on the

market. Fish scalers can range from handheld to large, commercial machines. This fish scaler is

handheld and was obviously imported to be sold at Buck's. Guinea watermen and related family,

including Edla Smith used tools such as this to scale their fish before selling them to canneries or

shipping them to market (18). Fish scalers bridge the connection between the fishing process and

the marketing process.
